Course Objective: Using and understanding statistics and statistical procedures have become required skills in virtually every profession and academic discipline. The purpose of this course is to help students grasp basic statistical concepts and techniques, and to expose students to real-life problems for applying them. Upon completion of this course, the student will be prepared to interpret and use statistics that they encounter both in connection with their discipline and in every-day life. The student will also be able to conduct basic statistical inference.

Class Assignments: Assignments will be given almost daily, but not collected/graded. For most students, success in a statistics course is achieved through completion of the homework assignments. Homework problems may show up on the exams throughout the semester.

Calculators: Calculators may be used (and are encouraged) for all homework and exams.

Attendance: Regular attendance and active participation is expected. Students are responsible for class work even if there are legitimate reasons for their absence. Attendance will not be taken.

Academic Dishonesty: Academic dishonesty will **NOT** be tolerated in this class and will be dealt with according to BSU protocol.

Exams: There will be four exams. Students may use a calculator and the formula card from the text on the exams. The final exam must be taken to pass the course. Following is the exam schedule:
